Toilets:	Disabled access and baby changing facilities.
Disabled Facilities:	Fully accessible. Disabled parking spaces & toilets.
Child Facilities:	Toys and activities available to take to your table. Arts and crafts area.

TRAVEL

Bus: From Liverpool city centre take the 68 bus which drops you directly outside the prison. This is the only bus that travels along Hornby Road.

Train: From Liverpool Central station you can travel to either Walton or Rice Lane train stations, these are both located on Hornby Road.

Car: M62 junction 6 onto the M57. Leave at junction 6. At the roundabout take the 1st exit onto A506. Turn left onto A59, at traffic signals turn right A5098 arrive at Hornby Road.

Local taxis: Delta 0151 924 7373

Car Parking: Car parking is available on the road facing the prison for a maximum of 2 hours.

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW HMP LIVERPOOL

1

To book your first visit phone 0151 530 4050 or visit www.gov.uk/prison-visits. You will need the full name, DOB and prison number of the person you are visiting and the names and DOB of each visitor.

2

On your visit please ensure you have with you the correct Identification. You need to present a form of photographic ID such as a Passport, Driving License or citizens ID card. Contact the Visitor Centre for a full list of acceptable ID.

On arrival please go to the Visitor Centre to book in (open Mon-Fri, 8.30am – 5.00pm). Please arrive at least 15 minutes before the time of your visit. Car parking is available on the road opposite the prison for 2 hours only.

Drinks and refreshments are not currently available from the tea bar in the Visitor Centre. Lockers are available in the Visitor Centre and require a £1 coin.

All property has to be posted in. Please ensure you write the prisoner's name and prison number on the envelope and include your name and address inside parcel. Please contact the Visitor Centre for a full list items you can send in.

6

To transfer money to a prisoner visit www.gov.uk/send-prisoner-money. Money may be sent in by other means but only by special exemption. Please contact the prison for more information.

7

If you are under the age of 18 you cannot visit the prison alone, you must be accompanied by an adult.

8

The search procedure once in the prison will include passing through a metal detecting portal, a pat down search and sometimes the presence of passive drug dogs. Please speak to a member of POPS' staff if you have any concerns.

Visitors may only take their ID into the prison. No coats, bags, phones, money, keys or other items are permitted at the current time.

10

Prams or car seats are not allowed into the prison and need to be left in the Visitor Centre during your visit. A made-up feeding bottle, dummy, a spare nappy and some loose wipes can be taken on your visit.
